

The bad actors are out there: I recently attended the Zone 7 President's meeting where one of the topics of discussion concerned hackers, scammers and fraudsters and their attack on personal and business/club emails. We discussed this at the last LPR board meeting and I will pass on to you information recently received from Chip Witt, via email from our Zone Rep. Collin Fat. Chip is a security expert and President of Redwood Region:

Common Techniques of Frauds....

1. Using an urgent tone, requesting that the monetary funds or gift cards funds be transferred ASAP. 2. Stating in the fake email that the recipient is in a meeting (or out of the country) and cannot be disturbed by email exchange or phone calls. 3. Emails requesting fast action, especially if the request is not following normal procedures and poorly written. Note: Make a phone call to verify the legitimacy of any financial transaction prior to executing it. 4. Cyber-criminals will make sure they request a legitimate-looking amount to wire transfer, to avoid suspicion this is insight they would have gathered through their social

engineering research Note: Trust your gut; if something seems off or unusual assume fraudulent until it has been proven otherwise. Martin Licciardo, Special Agent, FBI Washington Field Office added, "The best way to avoid being exploited is to verify the authenticity of requests to send money by speaking to the authorized requester directly...don't rely on email alone."

I hope these fraudsters, hackers and scammers tips will be of help in any future encounters you may have with these low-life's. One very important thing to remember – any amount of LPR funds requested over \$100.00 must be approved by the board. The internet email system is a great way for us in LPR to communicate, but keep vigilant for those who don't have your best interests in mind…because their best interests are always on their minds.

**Finally:** The weather is becoming more Spring-like as the month of April draws us in, this is a good time to dust off the Porsche and blow the carbon out of the exhaust. You can interpret that last part any way you want. I think I'll venture out in the Porsche and maybe I'll see you on...the road ahead!



The then president of PCA was Charles Kuell and the then president of Golden Gate Region was Dwight Mitchell. Dwight later moved to the Sacramento Valley Region where he opened Autosport Technology and served as SVR president in 1983 and 1994.

Redwood Region currently has a membership of over 633 primary members and is one of the most active regions in Zone 7. The club has several events per month including tours, dinners, a monthly breakfast, an active autocross program, and participates in the Zone 7 concours series.

I would like to extend congratulations to club president Chip Witt, the board and the 633 members of the club for their 50 years of commitment to Porsche Club of America and for being a part of the largest single marque car club in the world! Russ suggested a 6 month trial of the subsidies with a limit of \$2k as an evaluation period.

Vince made motion to subsidize tours, rallye & GTG by \$5 and \$2 for tech sessions, no one seconded, motion dies.
