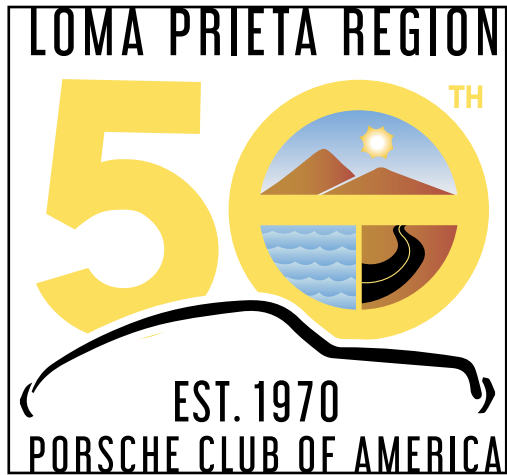

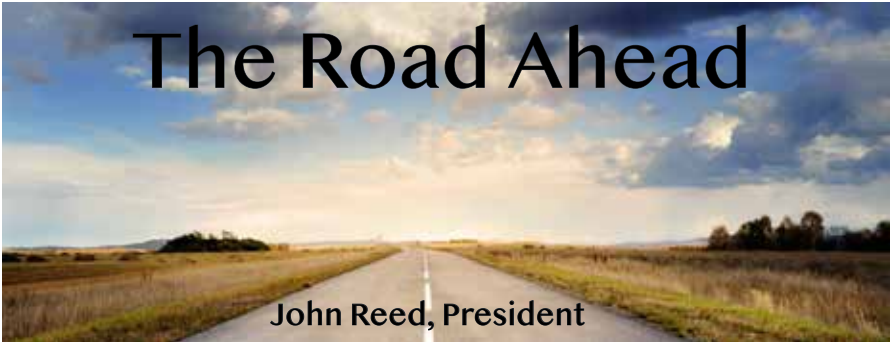

Porsche Awakenings...

A little nostalgia remembering the first time I saw a Porsche. The year was 1956, I was in the eighth grade and pals with Gordon Allen, a fellow who, like myself, had good times in mind at all times.

One day after school Gordon and I headed to his home to polish off homework, the dreaded requirement that is a passage of youth throughout school. As we walked and talked we approached his tree-lined street near San Jose State, turning a corner we came to a halt rather quickly and gazed in amazement at what was parked in his driveway – two brand new slate gray 356s. Of course we didn't know diddly about Porsche except the name across the trunk, later we were told this was the engine lid. Trunk? Engine lid? It was all German to us, but what beautiful German it was.

Good time to note that Gordon's parents were both very successful doctors, these matching 356s were his and hers anniversary present to themselves for a life of dedication and hard work. Onward...

As we walked around the new Porsches looking at every angle Gordon's dad, a broad smile on his face and an obvious proud owner, appeared and asked if we knew anything about these German made beauties, of course we didn't, but we were fascinated none-the-less. He proceeded to give us some technical stuff about engine displacement, drive train, transmission, suspension and we, in return, acted like we knew what he was talking about. He was pleased while we were still in the dark, but bubbling with knowledge we'd soon forget. We asked to look inside and there was the most gorgeous red leather interior with a larger-than-life steering wheel emblazoned with the Porsche Crest. Both 356s were exactly the same in color and interior. Gordon's dad asked if we wanted a ride and we said yes, of course! When the drive was completed I was hooked! Someday one of these would be mine.

I spent the next several years making the trek to the local VW dealer to check out the latest 356 Porsches, always hoping one would eventually come my way. Then, in 1965, the 911 model hit the streets and I was once again hooked. 356? 911? I didn't care which I would own but I

always had a feeling this would happen sooner rather than later; sooner happened before later. In September of 1970 Kathy and I purchased a new Irish Green 911T from Wester Porsche-Audi in Monterey. The story of how this Porsche purchase and our first involvement in LPR came about is one for another time, say, next month...bet you can hardly wait.
