#### Puttin' On A Tour, San Simeon Style

Current president John Reed has organized countless successful tours throughout his long tenure as an LPR member and past tour director. A recent club trip to San Simeon was a prime example of how he does it. John has partnered with a variety of people in doing tours, this time with his wife Angie and Peter Ridgeway, resulting in a delightful weekend experience. Russ and I

were privileged to be part of this group of forty-four "tourists" and want to

share how a good tour is planned and conducted.

1. Have an interesting destination in mind. Hearst Castle with a special night tour was the goal of our trip.

2. Search for interesting roads to reach that destination, especially scenic off-highway routes. Drive those roads several months ahead

to be sure they are still open and are good "Porsche roads". Keep track of the

mileage between turns and other specific helpful information for your written route instructions. Before heading to the coast, our route to San Simeon wound southeast through the countryside skirting Hollister, Paicines, and The Pinnacles. After a lunch stop in King City, we continued around Fort Hunter Liggett and Paso Robles. Some of us were even privileged to see deer, a fox, and a bobcat along the way.

3. Be sure to include rest stops with restrooms at strategic intervals. We appreciated a country church (on this month's cover) that welcomed tourists' use of their restrooms that were accessible from outside.

4. Find and plan a restaurant that can accommodate a large group for lunch. Our delicious buffet at Cork and Plough in King City had cost and food

details negotiated on the pre-run by Peter and John. Plenty of parking was available in a nearby lot, again pre-planned.

5. If planning a two day tour, make arrangements with a chosen motel/hotel for a block of rooms to be held for the group a specified amount of time at a prearranged cost. We all booked our own rooms

this time, but booking through the tour leader who can then hand out keys at the site can save time at arrival. The afterlunch portion of our tour passed by several wineries which provided stops for

those interested. Some of us drove straight to the motel, thus relieving our check-in by not arriving all at once. We appreciated the cordoned off parking just for our group at San Simeon Lodge. Some of us walked across Highway 1 to the beach, others chatted and admired the varied Porsches in the lot, and still others squeezed

in a nap before dinner.

6. Arrange a group dinner within walking distance of the motel with a few choices and a fixed price per person, prepaid. Be sure you know what the dinner price includes. On our trip, Russ was pleased with his huge steak while I enjoyed savory baked salmon. Other choices included Mediterranean chicken or Pasta Primavera.

7. Make arrangements for transportation and tickets for all to the selected venue if needed. After enjoying a spectacular sunset, we drove a short three miles to the Hearst Castle Visitor Center where we boarded a bus for a twisty ride up the hill to the castle on the hill, glowing like a small city. Its formal name in Spanish means "The Enchanted Hill". The castle at night is quite different from a daylight visit!

8. Do a pre-run about a month ahead, following your written directions and

Among the topics discussed included a financial report submitted by Zone treasurer, Howard Thomas, tips on succession and transition planning, membership retention, Parade 2020, and a report by each region on what went well and did not in their regions and also what goals they were working on for 2020. In attendance were; Brian Adkins (Diablo), Ed Hunter (Golden Gate), John Reed (Loma Prieta), Steve Taty (Monterey Bay), Craig Steele (Redwood), Gregg Plourde and Rob Lee (Sacramento Valley), Ed Suarez and Darrick Duerksen (Seguoia), Wayne Martin and Terry Topolski (Shasta), Millie Smith (Sierra Nevada), Chuck Pierce and David Boyd (Yosemite).

#### Zone 7 Awards Banquet:

The annual awards banquet was held in conjunction with the presidents meeting and was attended by nearly 60 competitors who participated in the Zone autocross and concours series. The concours series hosted 7 events over the year while the autocross series hosted 8 events.

The concours series overall winners by class were: Bill Sardella, Full Concours, Ken Lewis, Touring I, Thorsten And Simone Kopitzki, Touring II, and Jim McMahen, Street. The prestigious Rookie of the Year award went to Juan Fernandez.

In the autocross series, there were award winners in almost all of the classes with multiple

drivers who competed. The highly coveted PAX awards for men and women both had 3 award recipients. In the men's PAX, Grady Carter garnered top honors with Monty Pack finishing 2nd and Andrew Blyholder,rd. In the ladies PAX competition, Stacy O'Connell garnered top honors followed by Corrin Vanetti, 2nd place and Kelsey Leet, 3rd place. Kelsey was also honored as the Rookie of the Year for autocross.

Lastly, Himanshu Patel was honored as the Zone 7 Enthusiast of the Year and joins a very special group of past Zone members who have been so honored to have their name on the perpetual trophy.
