



September is harvest time, a great time to explore the farmsteads for fresh fruits and vegetables. Sunday the 22nd was "Drive Your Porsche Day", celebrating Ferry Porsche's Birthday (actually the 19th). It started out as Drive Your 356 Day, but has grown in some places to include all Porsches.

Two starting locations were set, Soquel (8 cars) and South Almaden Valley (6 cars), meeting for brunch at Ella's at the Airport, (3 others met

there). Ella's is low-key, has great food, located in the Watsonville main terminal, and Ella owned 356 Porsche before selling it to fund the restaurants. Being on the patio we could watch the planes land and take off as well as the skydivers landing nearby.

Starting off, our first stop was Clearview Orchards, and it was busy, so we parked in a dirt lot, you

could hear the grumbles about dust. But, soon that was forgotten, families enjoying the u-pick apples, pumpkins and fruit stand, all livened

Leaving there, we went up Larkin Valley and to Corralitos. Corralitos is Spanish for "little corrals", in the late 1700s, Mission Santa Cruz set up an outpost here to graze cattle for hides and tallow. Nowadays it's famous for sausages and smoked meats, all done



at the Market. Several bought sausages and snacks, we bought their bacon too, cooking it reminded me of camping, cooking on an open fire.

Setting out for Live Earth farm we traveled some less than perfectly paved roads, dodging potholes, we arrived to face another dirt driveway and parking, OH NO!!!!, dust on my Porsche... Live Earth is a community based farm, with u-pick berries, tomatoes, and apples along with other harvested

crops being sold at their stand.




Yosemite Region 60th Anniversary: Sunday, October 27th

September 3rd, 2019. Call to order at 7:00PM

August 2019 Board Meeting Minutes (Motion by Kris, Iain seconded, passed unanimously)

Board Member Reports:

President – John Reed. Attended Aug. 12th PCA Bof Directors meeting telephone conf call. Several agenda items discussed and voted upon. Received notice from PCA that we received a rebate.

Vice Presidents – Lisa Radding and Kris Vanacore reported on events: This month we have the upcoming Oktoberfest (9/21/19) event Hosted by Kat Hsueh and will be held at the Rinconada Hills Club House. See attached contract from the HOA for our reservation and details. A check will be required for deposit. I'm guessing we need to discuss at Board meeting for final details. As previously discussed as a non-profit our cost to rent hourly is \$50.00. I would think we should rent a minimum of 5 hours. We'll have full access to the clubhouse, kitchen, outdoor patio and Bocce court.

Discussion: \$500 doesn't include cleaning deposit. \$675 needs to be approved including refundable deposit & cleaning fee. John G. proposed, Lisa seconded, voted unanimously. Schedule is 4pm set up, tear down completed by 9pm. Surplus funds will be refunded to LPR after the event.


