



The Saga Continues...

Picking up this month from where I left off last month – purchasing our first Porsche. After getting the Porsche bug in 1956 when I first saw those two slate gray 356s at my friend's home, I can now fast forward to September of 1970 when the Porsche bug bit hard once again. The story goes like this...

Kathy and I were married in February 1970, two months later we placed an order for a new Datsun 240Z, the latest-greatest-everyman's sport car on the market. Our down payment was considerable and we believed we would be driving the Z within a few weeks. Wrong. After three months of bonehead excuses from the Datsun dealer (dock strikes, back ordered parts, lost cars in Nevada, etc.) we were getting discouraged and believing this purchase was not to be, but we gave the dealer a little more time to produce the car, then karma stepped in: The first week of September was vacation time for us, one thing we had planned was a stay at the Highlands Inn in Carmel on Tuesday and Wednesday with nothing much planned for the rest of the week. Then Karma once again stepped in: We were the subject of a terrible blunder that would lead to our true car-calling... a new Porsche.

Even though we hardly ever drove to the Monterey/Carmel area, we were confident that we knew where we were going, but we left plenty of time just in case we got lost and needed directions...this was the pre- internet maps/GPS era and of course we didn't have a paper map to consult. Young, dumb but happy! Motoring along in our '68 Opel Rallye Sport and getting close to Monterey we decided to exit the Del Monte off ramp and ask someone if we were close to our destination. Where we ended up was on auto row which, at that time, was quaint compared to today's mega auto malls. One dealer in particular stood out as we drove by—Wester Porsche/Audi with all those gorgeous Porsches on display. I asked Kathy if she wanted to take a look, since we had plenty of time and we were lost, she said sure.

We were greeted by Tom Battero who, as a good salesman should, asked if we were interested in looking at and possibly buying a Porsche. Of

course we were but figured it was out of our price range, the 240Z was half the cost of a new Porsche, but we listened to his pitch anyway. Tom persuaded us to take a test drive with him at the wheel. That did it! Even with Kathy squashed into the back jump seats while Tom was hanging corners, our eyes and insides were enjoying the ride. After the test ride we talked more about financing or a lease, something new at that time, but we needed one more test drive on our own. Tom pointed out an Irish Green 911T that might be of interest, we said yes. Tom handed us the keys, smiled and said enjoy the ride, but come back sometime today! We all laughed knowing we wouldn't be gone that long, but just long enough to get reeled in hook, line and sinker. Time to get serious or go on our way. We got serious.

After once again discussing the options we decided on giving the lease a shot, with a down payment this made it possible to get into a Porsche within our budget, I bet there's a few of you out there that have done the same, right? But the deal wasn't a done deal yet, we still had to talk it over before diving into this Porsche venture. Get this...and it will never happen again – we gave the dealer a \$50.00 deposit to hold the car which they accepted, but we had to get back to them before the close of business that day with our decision. Fifty bucks to hold a '70 911T, try that now and see what happens!

We bid Tom and others adieu and found our way to the Highlands Inn. After checking in we wandered into the bar, ordered a drink, and talked about the Porsche deal. Yes? No? Maybe? This discussion went on for around 45 minutes with Kathy saying how much she wanted the car and me nodding my head casually in agreement, I wanted to make sure that she wanted this Porsche as much as I did; She did and my casual, ho-hum demeanor became a loud "yes!" I used the house phone to call the dealer to let them know the purchase was on. There was a slight moment of silence on their part, but then the laughter started, they told us they knew were going for it and that 'our' Porsche was taken off of the lot, out of sight in "the back away from the public." Our 50 buck deposit did the trick!

On our way home the next day we spent time at the dealer filling out paperwork, we said we'd return on Saturday with the deposit which was fine with them. The Porsche would be detailed with a full tank of gas and ready for delivery. One pleasure, which had been building up, was going to the Datsun dealer, asking for our deposit check back and tearing it up in front of them and tossing it into a waste basket. They didn't care for that, so I told them where they could shove their 240Z and with that two future Porsche owners left the building for a drive to Monterey. As promised, when we arrived, there sat our Irish Green 911T detailed and fueled and waiting for its new owners. My four year old son, Sean, drove home with me, Kathy followed close behind.


A few days later we inquired about joining the Porsche Club, the dealer said there was a new PCA region that began in March and may be a good fit for us, its name of course was Loma Prieta Region. My contact was a fellow named Ken Iles who sounded British on the phone, but I did my best to understand what he was saying. Ken invited us to an outdoor weekend PCA event in Los Gatos where we could meet other Porsche enthusiasts and members of LPR. We decided what the heck so it was off to Los Gatos where we met Ken and June and many PCA members who were the most enthusiastic bunch of Porsche owners this side of Germany. We were invited to attend an LPR weekend tour the latter part of September, which we accepted. We weren't disappointed. We had a lot of fun and laughs with this small but vocal PCA region. We joined LPR on the spot, Kathy had her arm twisted to run for the 1971 Secretary/Treasurer position and I volunteered to be the first Goodie Store Chair. Oh, we became members 35 & 36. 1970 turned out to be a very interesting year!

Finally...

LPR's 50th anniversary will be held on March 28th, 2020. I've seen the region evolve from its humble beginnings to over 500 members today. My only regret is that we didn't buy the Porsche sooner and could have joined the ranks as charter members - but we did eventually find LPR in 1970, or it found us, and the rest is history!
