



# Rallye! Really? Part 1 By Bob Frostholm

Shortly after joining LPR in May of 2008 several long-time members encouraged me to reach back into ancient history (The mid 1960s) when I was very active in the Bay Area Car Rallye scene. In 2009 I

mustered up the time, energy and memories to write a gimmick event for the club and that led a photo rallye, a scavenger hunt rallye, a poker rallye and a distance accuracy rallye.

For 2020 I have reserved 3 dates for Rallyes; **May 16th, June 20th and October 10th** for Rallyes.

At last night's GTG Soup Night I was talking with Doris & Russ Britschgi who are in charge of tours. They were looking at the LPR calendar and didn't want to conflict with the Rallye dates. The reason is simple. A Rallye is basically a simple tour with a game attached to it. Official "Tours" like those Doris and Russ may be organizing will likely take you to more exotic places on more interesting roads. A Rallye will navigate you from one place to another while you engage in a game (some more complicated than others).

While many of us "old timers" have had Rallye blood flowing in our veins for decades, I thought it would be appropriate to offer a little insight into this aspect of Porsche Sport to those who are unfamiliar with the goings on.


