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Miscellaneous Rambling and Back Story


Don Chaisson, Prieta POST editor. Tempus Fugit! Yes, Time does Fly!

It was only about a year ago that I published my first issue of The Prieta POST, so it's time to do a retrospective on the efforts so far. That first issue, the Nov/Dec 2022 was meager in size, only two "featured articles" and 26 pages (the two articles were large!) The Nov/Dec 2023 had 4 featured articles over 41 pages with added "contributions" such as Dear Poloma. Seems that I was able to bulk the POST up over 7 issues. That's good, right?

Lets take a deeper dive.

Starting with that Nov/Dec 2022 issue, I've tried to bring "good photography" to the pages of the POST. The first cover page had a pretty "artsy" photo teasing the article "How to take a photo of your Porsche". I still like that image! The cover page for the Nov/Dec 2023 issue reprised an iconic image from Rennsport Reunion 7 — yes "I" did take that shot, though I had to sneak onto the track at the turn 3 flag station to get it. I am pretty satisfied with the level of photographic imagery that we have been able to get for each issue. While there is always room for improvement when matched against inspirational cover pages by Michael Alan Ross for example, I think we are on the right track (compare a Panorama and POST cover page below).





Check one important box!

I stand by the decision to model the POST as an "e-zine" rather than a simple report of our region's activities. Dana Ambrisko does a really, really good job of providing current information, upcoming events and news of the day twice a month — the nuts and bolts of a "newsletter". No need for the POST to repeat dated content every other month! Yes, I do take a lot of inspiration from PCA's award winning publication, Panorama, for the POST's look and feel. To the extent that the POST inmates Panorama is a win for the POST. Check another important box.

Honestly, its a challenge to come up with "new" content that might be of interest to our membership each issue. Some board members have complained that I ignored the region's events. So, I started to include content about LPR events, but more in depth "stories" to bridge the gap between Dana's email blast summary and content with more meat on the past event bones. Getting attendees to make "content" contribution for these stories is definitely a blessing and powerful addition to the POST.

I'm not checking this box completely yet, but definitely in a better direction.

Apparently the POST is striking a cord with membership as the number of members who open up the issue and read it, often cover to cover and spending time on the articles and stories have been increasing. I think the POST is establishing its "brand" and credibility. But, I harken back to my interview with John Reed about Loma Prieta's early days and his service as POST editor for 6 years. Back in 1971-72 the issues were "type writer" prepared, what graphics he had were manually laid out and the issues had no color photography. The content was expansive, interesting and well received by the membership. I'm sure you would agree by checking out the 1971 issue on the website "past issues" page. But don't take my word for it, PCA recognized his work with its national Paul Check out Panorma's recent article about LPR members Heinmiller Award, presented at the 1972 Parade.

So, I am humbly aware of making the POST the best is can be is a high bar.

So, what's next? I'm not satisfied with the graphic designs I've used. I've started studying the "anatomy of a Magazine Layout" for inspiration. I routinely study other region's products and professional magazine designs for article/content presentation. The POST's introductions need to make you want to read the content, graphic design helps do that. Take a look at a recent article in Golfjournal



(remember I love golf as much as Porsches!) This article is about how a junior program, The First Tee, inspired Latina women and girls to get involved with golf. The photo has a lady looking at the title, the headline and "kicker. It shouts, "READ MORE".




The page just leaps out and says, "read all about it". Of course it does help to have photos by Michael Alan Ross (my favorite car photographer!) doing the artwork.



DAC: I'm getting the sense of being overwhelmed with the technology that powers this level of detail. The PCA Tech Tactics event is advertised to get into that sort of detail, but, based on your experience, what is needed to "get started" in SIM Racing?

Jeff: I encourage anyone interested to check out the PCA Sim Racing website at www.pcasimracing.com as they have some awesome resources to help you get started, and videos that walk through what you'll need. In short, you'll need a PC computer (iRacing does not work currently support Apple operating systems) and a steering wheel/pedal combination. It works best with force-feedback wheels to help with realism. Since the program uses iRacing platform, you have to subscribe to iRacing. The monthly fee is about \$10 per month. The PCA Sim Racing league is free to PCA members as part of your PCA membership. You do need to "purchase" your car — it's sort of an app fee of about \$13 per car and is a one-time purchase. Same thing for a license to a "track", such as Laguna Seca, or Imola Autodromo, which is one of my favorites! I've also added a subwoofer behind my racing seat that provides non-audible sensory input helps to feel rumble strips, that sort of thing. Entry level equipment is available on Amazon, such as Logitech wheel/ pedal combinations for less than \$300. Professional level force feedback steering wheels and bases can run upwards of \$1000, so the sky is the limit. But there are participants using all varieties of hardware/technology and do very well



